The RRC advises all operators under the its jurisdiction in areas of potential danger to exercise precaution and take the following actions:

- Monitor local, state and national weather reports for updates on potential wildfire impacts;
- Secure all personnel, equipment, and facilities to protect the safety of personnel; and,
- Monitor and prepare operations for potential impacts, as safety permits.
