**Texas Belle Pipeline Tariff**

1. Owner of Pipeline System
  - a. Williams Purity Pipelines, LLC (“WPPL”) offices in Tulsa, Oklahoma.
  
2. Description of System
  - a. “WPPL Texas Belle Pipeline” consists of the pipeline, custody transfer measurement facilities, pipeline connections, and all other necessary equipment which extends from Mont Belvieu, Texas to the Houston, Texas area.
  
3. Product
  - a. “Isobutane” means the product, composed primarily of isobutane, conforming to WPPL’s specifications.
  
4. Origins and Destinations
  - a. “Receipt Points” on the WPPL Texas Belle Pipeline are at the flange downstream of the custody meter for the applicable receipt point and are as follows:
    - i. Oneok storage facility in Mont Belvieu, Texas
  
  - b. “Delivery Points” on the WPPL Texas Belle Pipeline are as follows:
    - i. The TPC Houston Plant, in Houston, Texas
  
5. Fee
  - a. A Shipper shall make a commitment (“Volume Commitment”) to ship, or pay transportation fees for, 2,920,000 barrels per year on the WPPL Texas Belle Pipeline. In exchange for this Volume Commitment, Shipper shall pay an “Incentive Transportation Fee” of 2.006 cents per gallon on all barrels committed to WPPL each month.
  
  - b. Commencing on the Effective Date of the agreement, and in any Contract Year thereafter, Shipper’s “Deficiency Volumes” shall be the amount by which Shipper’s actual shipments are less than the Shipper’s Volume Commitment during the same Contract Year.
  
  - c. The rate may be increased by WPPL annually by taking 15% of the fee in effect, multiplying that by 2%, and adding the result to the fee in effect, effective January 1 of each year, in accordance with the agreement.

6. Allocation.

- a. In circumstances where the transportation of Product on the WPPL Texas Belle Pipeline is restricted, limited, or otherwise prorated for any reason, WPPL may reduce the volume of Product delivered or received at the Delivery Points or Receipt Points in an equitable allocation with all other similarly situated customers then moving Product on the WPPL Texas Belle Pipeline. Historical monthly volumes may be taken into account to help determine the equitable allocation.

7. Start-Up and Effective Date of Tariff

- a. This tariff is being filed to be effective on March 10, 2015 with the Texas Railroad Commission.

8. Regulations

- a. The WPPL Texas Belle Pipeline is an intrastate common carrier pipeline system regulated by the Texas Railroad Commission.

9. Disclaimer

- a. Specific details on system operating capabilities, nominations, scheduling, off-specification product, measurement of product, etc. are contained in a Transportation Services Agreement each Shipper enters into prior to having rights to ship on this system.

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
