RRC continues to exceed well-plugging goals

RRC's well plugging program already plugged 1,000 wells by the end of June, reaching the Legislature's Fiscal Year 2022 performance measure two months ahead of schedule. This program addresses wells that are no longer productive and are considered orphaned in accordance with state laws and regulations. the safety and environmental risks associated with abandoned wells. Using a risk-based ranking system, RRC's program prioritizes the plugging of abandoned oil and gas wells that present the greatest threat to public health and safety and the environment. Since its inception in 1984, the program has plugged more than 40,000 wells across Texas using revenue paid by industry.

Texas Oil & Gas Production Statistics for April 2022

Crude oil and natural gas production as reported to the RRC for April 2022 came from 162,301 oil wells and 79,292 gas wells. RRC reports that from May 2021 to April 2022, the total reported production in Texas was 1.5 billion barrels of crude oil and 10.8 trillion cubic feet of total gas.
